### **Current and Emerging Issues**

- Inflation is impacting the cost of food, gas, and other essential living items
- Challenging labor market is impacting homeless shelter/service providers
- Rapidly rising housing costs
- Increases in evictions and foreclosures
- Increases in first-time homeless

- Extremely low vacancy rates in housing market
- 7 Funding for many eviction prevention programs must be COVID related
- Eandlord reluctance to rent to tenants with credit & eviction histories
- Pandlord reluctance to accept temporary housing subsidies versus permanent housing subsidies like Section 8
- Long wait lists due to the lack of new affordable housing units

### ACTIONS/PROGRESS: SYSTEMS-ORIENTED APPROACH

Goal accomplished! Established a systemsoriented approach to address homelessness through the following actions:

- √ 06/20 Adoption of Homeless Strategic Plan
- ✓ 07/20 Approval of FY 2021 Homeless Solutions Annual Action Plan
- ✓ 08/21 Approval of FY 2022 Homeless Solutions Annual Action Plan

The City of Corona and its public/private partners are building a coordinated system of services to address homelessness

### GOAL #2 Emergency Shelter

### **STATUS**



### ACTIONS/PROGRESS: MOTEL EMERGENCY SHELTER

- 20 motel rooms per night with ability to expand during winter months
- ✓ Utilization is close to 100% most of the time as program exits are quickly filled
- From January 2020 December 2021, the program provided:
  - □ 13,051 Shelter Bed Nights
  - □ 10,458 Motel Room Nights
- Average fully-loaded cost of motel room, case management and wrap around services is \$88.22
- Due to economy/housing market, permanent housing placement percentage is 28%

### GOAL #2 Emergency Shelter

### **STATUS**



### ACTIONS/PROGRESS: PATH OF LIFE SHELTER

- Expanded from 5 to 10 beds in October 2021
- √ 10 shelter beds per night with designations for 7 male beds and 3 female beds
- ✓ 1,516 shelter bed nights provided from June 2021 to December 2021
- Due to market challenges and length of stay issues, only 4% of the 48 clients served in the six-month period had successful housing placements
- Of the 48 clients served, 31 were official referrals from CPD and City Net. Path of Life served an additional 17 Corona clients above the 10 beds reserved by contract

- √ 03/22 Release of Operator RFP
- √ 03/22 Security System contract award to Council
- ✓ 04/22 Prime contract award to Council
- √ 07/22 Operator contract award to Council
- √ 09/22 Estimated construction completion
- ✓ 12/22 Estimated opening of shelter / navigation center

    - Homeless Neighbors: regular and consistent outreach, engagement and connection to resources
    - Businesses & Residents: Regular and consistent resource to address trespassing, illegal camping, and related issues

### GOAL #5 Develop and Participate in **Sub-Regional Collaboratives** with **Neighboring** Cities

### ACTIONS/PROGRESS: MOU WITH CITY OF NORCO

- √ 06/21 Corona City Council approved renewal of \$537,011 MOU for FY 2022
- √ 07/21 Norco City Council approval of same
- ✓ 12/21 Joint City collaboration to write and submit \$1M grant application to the County for a State encampment response grant
- ✓ 02/22 Clean-up of 9.8 tons of debris from the riverbed after 10 months of joint City collaboration with Norco Sheriff's Dept, City Net & the County to connect 9 Norco homeless to shelter & housing
- O2/22 Norco Council and City Manager applaud results of partnership. Planning for renewal of FY 2023 MOU is underway

- ✓ 04/21 Collaboration with CPD, CFD, City Net 10/21 Homeless Solutions, Community Services and the County to connect 12 Corona homeless to shelter and housing
- ✓ 10/21 Clean-up of 160 cubic yards of debris from Corona Prado Basin
- ✓ 12/21 Homeless Solutions wrote and submitted a \$1 M encampment response grant

### ACTIONS/PROGRESS: CPD Motel Voucher Crisis Fund

✓ 08/21 - CPD, CPCP, Homeless Solutions, and Corona Chamber collaboration to expand fund

Results: 100 Women Who Care \$6,600 Schulze Foundation \$3,300 Corona Chamber \$300 Total Donations \$10,200



## GOAL #6 Develop Public/Private Partnerships to Support Plan Initiatives

### ACTIONS/PROGRESS: State PLHA Grant

- ✓ Year 1 Allocation = \$582,003
- <u>Year 2 Allocation = \$904,613 (Council approval 02/22)</u>
  Total \$1,486,616
- ✓ Will provide an estimated 63% of operating costs for the Harrison Emergency Shelter/Navigation Center in FY 2023
- ✓ Great example of leveraging City General Funds!

Note: HOME Tenant Based Rental Assistance will be used for eviction prevention to help Corona residents afford existing housing and rental assistance to facilitate housing placements from City shelter programs

# GOAL #10 Expand Data Tracking System and Dashboard to Measure Performance

### ACTIONS/PROGRESS: Data System & Dashboard Reports

- Dashboard report developed and presented to City Council every six months
- Phase II Dashboard reports primarily focus on system measures as components of Corona's system of services are still being developed
- Once Harrison Shelter and Housing Programs are launched, data tracking system will be further developed with contracted operator
- Homeless Solutions is currently contributing performance measure data as part of City's Strategic Plan Quarterly Report updates to City Council
