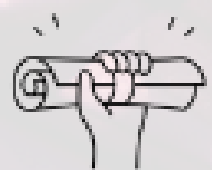

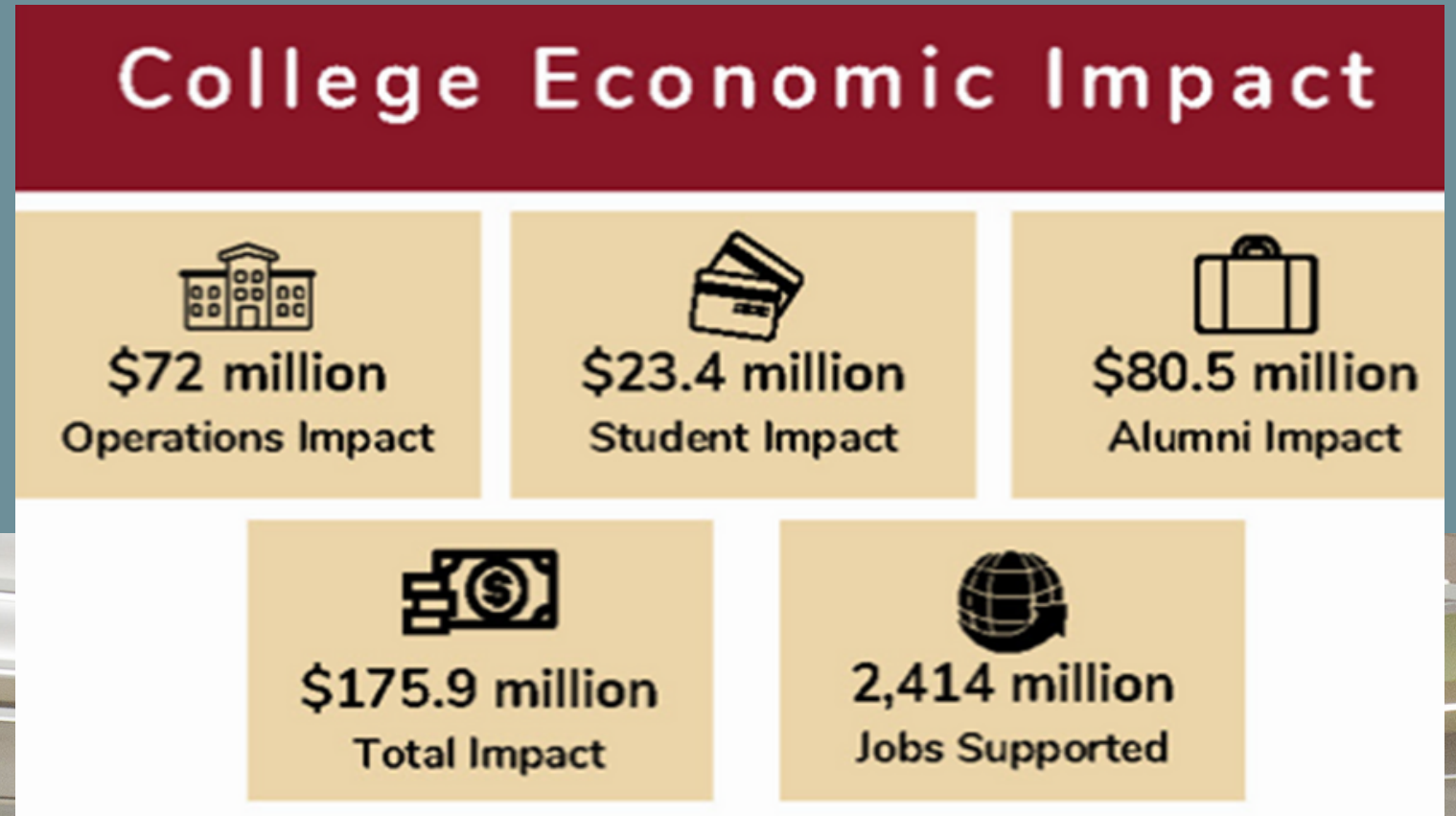




After 30 years, Updates Are Needed

Norco College is struggling to find suitable, up-to-date classroom space as enrollment and requirements for STEM and safety classes, and the need for veteran support increases.

These realities mean that the College is struggling to maintain the quality education at an affordable price, on which our local students, families, and local veterans rely.



Basic Repairs and Updates Needed

Additional funding is needed upgrade spaces for IT systems, equipment, classrooms and career training facilities to keep pace with current industry standards.

Funding is also needed for continuing basic repairs at current facilities including water, asbestos, electrical, earthquake, parking lot safety lighting and upgrades, among others.



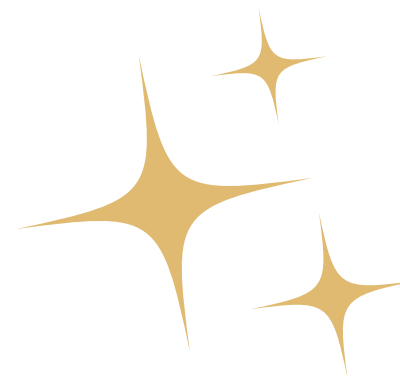
Working to Maintain Critical Programs
