Winter Maintenance begins - Parks and LMD's


- Bi-Weekly Mowing
- Crews will begin heavy trimming, raising tree skirts, dead heading shrubs and cleaning up leaf debris
- Turf is going dormant (yellowing and slow growth)
- Trees will begin dropping on many deciduous trees



Preparations for coming rains - San Ramon/ San Alvarado

- Cleaning V-ditches and drains
- Removing any vegetation blocking drains
- Cleaning of drain lines
- Installation of straw wattles, sandbags and silt fencing
- ▶ Hauling of spoils off site, completed week of November 4th

Turf Removal Update:





- Zone 10 and 7: areas planted and currently in maintenance periods
- 2001-1 and Zone 14: irrigation installation, boulder placement and plantings are being put in along Ontario, Buena Vista, Taylor and Magnolia

Winter Field Shut Downs

- Winter shut downs begin this week
- Field renovations will include:
 - Aeration
 - Over seeding
 - Topdressing
 - Fertilizing
 - Infield nail dragging
 - Infield skinning and leveling
 - Infield irrigation maintenance
