## **RESOLUTION NO. 2023-035**

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CORONA, CALIFORNIA, ACKNOWLEDGING THE SUBMISSION AND PUBLIC RELEASE OF CORONA POLICE DEPARTMENT 2022 ANNUAL MILITARY EQUIPMENT REPORT (POLICY 709 & AB 481) AND RENEWING ORDINANCE NO. 3347 WHICH ADOPTED POLICY 709 PURSUANT TO CITY OF CORONA ORDINANCE 3347 AND GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 7070 *ET SEQ*.

WHEREAS, on September 30, 2021, Governor Gavin Newsom signed into law Assembly Bill 481, codified at California Government Code sections 7070 through 7075 ("AB 481"), relating to the use of military equipment by law enforcement agencies;

WHEREAS, Government Code Section 7071 requires law enforcement agencies to obtain the approval of its governing body, by an ordinance adopting a military equipment use policy, prior to requesting military equipment from the federal government, seeking funds for military equipment, including grants and donations, acquiring military equipment, collaborating with another law enforcement agency in the use of military equipment in the jurisdiction of the governing body, using any new or existing military equipment in a manner not previously approved by the governing body, or entering into an agreement for funding, receipt, acquisition, use of, or collaboration in the use of military equipment;

**WHEREAS,** in accordance with the requirements of Government Code Section 7071, on or about June 1, 2022 the City Council adopted Ordinance 3347, by which it approved Corona Police Department Policy 709 (Military Equipment), including an exhibit listing the military equipment in possession of the City (Corona Police Department Specialized Equipment Inventory");

**WHEREAS**, Ordinance 3347 and Government Code Section 7071 also require the City Council to review Ordinance 3347 at least annually at a regular meeting and to vote on whether to renew the ordinance, while making the following determination based upon the annual military equipment report (discussed below): whether each type of military equipment identified in the annual report has complied with the standards for approval set forth in Government Code Section (d)(1);

WHEREAS, Government Code Section 7072 requires the Corona Police Department to prepare an annual military equipment report which, at a minimum, includes the following information for the immediately preceding calendar year for each type of military equipment: (1) a summary of how the military equipment was used and the purpose of its use; (2) a summary of any complaints or concerns received concerning the military equipment; (3) the results of any internal audits, any information about violations of the military equipment use policy, and any actions taken in response; (4) the total annual cost for each type of military equipment, including acquisition, personnel, training, transportation, maintenance, storage, upgrade, and other ongoing costs, and from what source funds will be provided for the military equipment in the calendar year following submission of the annual military equipment report; (5) the quantity possessed for each type of military equipment; and (6) if the City intends to acquire additional military equipment in the next year, the quantity sought for each type of military equipment;

WHEREAS, the Corona Police Department has prepared the following annual report in compliance with Government Code Section 7072, which annual report is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference: Corona Police Department 2022 Annual Military Equipment Report (Policy 709 & AB 481) ("2022 Annual Report");

WHEREAS, Ordinance 3347 and Government Code Section 7072 also require the Corona Police Department, within 30 days of submitting and publicly releasing the 2022 Annual Report, to hold at least one well-publicized and conveniently located community engagement meeting, at which the general public may discuss and ask questions regarding the annual military equipment report and the law enforcement agency's funding, acquisition, or use of military equipment;

WHEREAS, the Corona Police Department released its 2022 Annual Report on April 20, 2023 and is holding its community engagement meeting in compliance with Government Code Section 7072 during the City Council meeting of May 3, 2023; and

**WHEREAS,** Government Code Section 7072 requires the 2022 Annual Report to be made publicly available on the City's website for as long as the military equipment is available for use.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Council of the City of Corona, California as follows:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> 2022 Annual Report – Submission & Public Release. The City Council hereby acknowledges the submission and public release of the Corona Police Department 2022 Annual Military Equipment Report (Policy 709 & AB 481) attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference ("2022 Annual Report").

<u>SECTION 2</u>. <u>2022 Annual Report – Continuous Website Public Availability</u>. The 2022 Annual Report shall be made publicly available on the City's website for as long as the military equipment is available for use.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> Ordinance 3347 – Findings for Renewal. Based on the 2022 Annual Report, as well as the entire record before the City Council and all written and oral evidence presented to the City Council, the City Council hereby finds and determines that each type of military equipment identified in the 2022 Annual Report has complied with the following standards for approval set forth in Government Code Section (d)(1):

A. The military equipment identified in the 2022 Annual Report is necessary because there is no reasonable alternative that can achieve the same objectives of officer and civilian safety.

B. The 2022 Annual Report and Policy 709 will safeguard the public's welfare, safety, civil rights, and civil liberties.

C. Any equipment identified in the 2022 Annual Report and proposed to be purchased pursuant to Policy 709 is reasonably cost effective compared to available alternatives that can achieve the same objectives of officer and civilian safety.

D. Military equipment used in 2022 complied with Policy 709 and/or the military equipment use policy that was in effect at the time, or if such uses did not comply with the military use policy, corrective action has been taken to remedy nonconforming uses and ensure future compliance.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> Ordinance 3347 – Renewal. Based on the 2022 Annual Report, as well as the entire record before the City Council and all written and oral evidence presented to the City Council, the City Council hereby renews Ordinance 3347.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> Ordinance 3347 – Continuous Website Public Availability. Ordinance 3347 shall remain publicly available on the City's website for as long as the military equipment is available for use.

<u>SECTION 6.</u> <u>Community Engagement Meeting</u>. Based on the entire record before the City Council and all written and oral evidence presented to the City Council, the City Council hereby finds that the meeting at which this Resolution was considered satisfies the requirement to timely hold at least one well-publicized and conveniently located community engagement meeting, at which the general public may discuss and ask questions regarding the 2002 Annual Report and the Corona Police Department's funding, acquisition, or use of military equipment.

SECTION 7. California Environmental Quality Act. This Resolution is exempt pursuant to Section 15061(b)(3) of the Guidelines for the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), which states that a project is exempt from CEQA if the activity is covered by the common-sense exemption that CEQA applies only to projects that have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment. Where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment, the activity is not subject to CEQA. This action simply acknowledges the submission and public release of the 2022 Annual Report and renews Ordinance 3347, and there is no possibility that adopting this Resolution will have a significant effect on the environment. Therefore, no environmental analysis is required. SECTION 8. Severability. If any section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, or clause or phrase in this Resolution or any part thereof is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, invalid or ineffective by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity or effectiveness of the remaining portions of this Resolution or any part thereof. The City Council hereby declares that it would have adopted each section irrespective of the fact that any one or more subsections, subdivisions, sentences, clauses, or phrases are declared unconstitutional, invalid, or ineffective.

<u>SECTION 9</u>. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
