





Literacy Workshops for Parents/Caregivers with Children Ages 5-7*



*This program is intended for parents/caregivers. Active participation is highly encouraged.

A series of 10 workshops: Each workshop is divided into 2 parts

4:00-4:30 PM

Parent/Caregiver Time:

Parents/caregivers learn tips for supporting literacy development at home and practice with learning exercises.

Child Time:

Children participate in a storytime and activities independently.

4:30-5:00 PM

Together Time:

Families reconvene to practice their learned reading strategy together.




The Summer Reading Challenge (SRC) is free for all ages and reading abilities. All reading, listening, learning, and Summer At Your Library (SAYL) events count.

- Registration and logging is open from June 4–July 29. In order to protect your information, we delete registration information from past years. Please create a new account to access the 2023 Summer Reading Challenge by clicking the green register button on the left. Please note that this is separate from your library login, which will not work to login to the challenge. If you need help registering, click on the "Help" tab above for a step-by-step guide.
- 2. Paper logs are available in English and Spanish at the SAYL BOOTH
- 3. READERS 0-5 will earn points for prizes for each time they read a book!


 READERS 6-12 will earn points for prizes for the minutes they read!

 READERS 13+ will earn points for prizes for the minutes they read!

 All Readers earn prizes by reaching 200 points, 400 points, 600 points, 800 points and 1,000 points. Also, earn a free book and coupon packet when you reach 1,200 points! There is an extra prize for readers who read above and beyond and reach 2,400 points! Readers who reach the 600 points level will also be invited to the Finishers Party on August 4th.
- Prize distribution begins Tuesday, <u>June 20th</u> and will continue through Friday, August 4th.
