



Draft 2024 Traffic Relief Plan...


- Identifies County-wide transportation projects and services

TRP Example Projects



- Construct auxiliary lanes on I-15 in Corona
- Add at least one new lane on SR-91, between SR -241 and SR-71 in the eastbound direction
- Add at least one new lane on SR-91, between I-15 in Corona and Pierce St. in Riverside in both directions



- Construct a rapid transit connection from the 91 Express Lanes to the North Main Corona Transit Center
- Maintain and enhance existing stations
- Increase frequency and safety on buses
- Coachella Valley Rail



- Pothole repairs and road maintenance
- Local safety improvements, and traffic management systems



- Improve safety and expand access to pedestrian sidewalks and bicycle lanes
- Santa Ana River Trail




 Construct multi-modal transportation corridors on major road such as Cajalco Rd. between I-15 and I-215



• Expand Freeway Service Patrol on I-15 and SR-91



- Mitigate Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT)
- Land conservation through MSHCP






Economic Impact & Regional Investment

Accountability to Taxpayers


- Independent audits and mandatory reviews
- Local Voice. Local Control No funds to be diverted to Sacramento or Washington D.C.
- No more than 1% can be used for administrative salaries

Transportation Funding Support

- Great or some need for funding
- Support for funding measure: Riverside County voters
- Support for funding measure: Corona, Norco, Eastvale, Jurupa Valley & surrounding area

- 82% of Riverside County voters see a need for transportation funding
- **67%** of Riverside County voters initially support a transportation funding measure
- 66% of Corona, Norco, Eastvale, Jurupa Valley & surrounding area voters initially support transportation funding measure
