
- HUD requires grantees to prepare a Consolidated Plan, 5 Action Plans and 5 Performance Reports (24 CFR Part 91)

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

Statutory limitations on use of funds:

- 20% cap grant administration
- 15% cap public service activities
- Remainder used for other housing, community and economic development activities



Public Service Grants

- Competitive NOFA issued November 2017
- Will result in a 3-year funding commitment
- Provides a stable source of funds to keep non-profits focused on service delivery and capacity building efforts to achieve long-term sustainability
- NOFA requirements:
 - Applicants agreed to provide quarterly accomplishment reports from the beginning of the grant (July 1, 2018) to five (5) years subsequent to the grant (June 30, 2026)
 - For the future, applicants agreed not to apply for additional CDBG funds unless the application is for a new service, new program or constitutes a quantifiable increase above and beyond the level of service already provided (inclusive of 2018, 2019, 2020 CDBG)


