

84 miles of the 113 mile Santa Ana River Trail have been completed, only 29 miles left to go





- Non-profit organization. Santa Ana River Trust to raise funds and support, organize activities.
- Funding. Stable, diversified funding sources.
- State agency creation. The Santa Ana River Conservancy.

The Santa Ana River is a treasured resource. Flowing nearly 100 miles from its northernmost reaches at the crest of the San Bernardino Mountains out to the coast near Huntington Beach, the river runs through wild lands, agriculture, parks, towns, and cities, touching the lives of millions of Californians.

State Agency Creation

- The SAR Trail and Parkway Partnership led to establishment of the state Santa Ana River Conservancy
- Conservancy created by legislature in 2014
- First priority to develop a watershed wide plan to direct bond fund expenditures

The Santa Ana River Conservancy is charged with...

- Santa Ana River Trail and Parkway
- Trail connections, trail heads and amenities
- Open space
- Wildlife habitat and species restoration, enhancement, and protection
- Wetland restoration and protection
- Agricultural land restoration and protection
- Protection and maintenance of water quality
- Related educational uses
- Public access for recreation and education purposes

- Neighbors adamantly against development


