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Reducing Homelessness

The city of Rialto was selected to receive \$600,759 in grant funding from the Homeless Emergency Aid Program (HEAP)

Through the Homeless Emergency Services Program (HESP), the City of Rialto will provide immediate and comprehensive services pertaining to homelessness. HESP is a collaboration of services between the City of Colton and other Community based Partners that will serve the local population of those who are homeless or at imminent risk of homelessness.

Program Services

1 Navigation Services

Connecting target population with essential resources

2 Prevention Services

Providing resources and services tailored to unique needs

3 Case Management

Identify barriers that impeded access to housing

4 Operations

Operating support for short-term and comprehensive homeless services

5 Housing Vouchers

Provide emergency shelter vouchers for temporary housing

6 Rapid Re-Housing Programs

Using the Housing First Model, provide speedy solutions and supportive services for families and individuals to exit homelessness and return to permanent housing

7 Health and Safety Education

Prevention/intervention for youth and adults, focused on providing mental health counseling and education

Meet Our Partners

City of Colton

Will assist in expanding the current T.E.A.M. Services Network to assist individuals and families within our target population with emergency, reverse referrals, and navigation services.

Clay Counseling Solutions

Will oversee Intake and Case Management for the program, and focus on therapeutic counseling and prevention services.

Rialto Family Health Services

Will provide shelter vouchers, homeless veteran services, toiletries and groceries.

SBC Pathways Network

Will provide rapid re-housing cost, and on-time financial assistance with non-housing related costs.

Vera's Open Arms Incorporated

Will steward the 24-hr hotline services, crisis intervention, drop in counseling and domestic violence services.

Knock, Knock Angels

Will provide interior design makeovers for the living space of the client. Makeovers include fresh linens, dishes and utensils, furniture, electronics, appliances, and home décor.



What long Term Results Do We Expect?

Following the Project Phases

Initiation

Joining with our service partners, we will identify and address the target population with service-oriented solutions, and go on long-term goals.

Planning

The City of Rialto and its service partners are preparing for immediate implementation to begin May 1, 2019

Implementation

Through the Rialto Homeless Advisory Council and outreach, the HESP project aims to serve approximately 100-150 at-risk and/or high-risk persons each year that are homeless or on the verge of becoming homeless.

50% of funding shall be expanded by May 31, 2020 and 100% by May 31, 2021

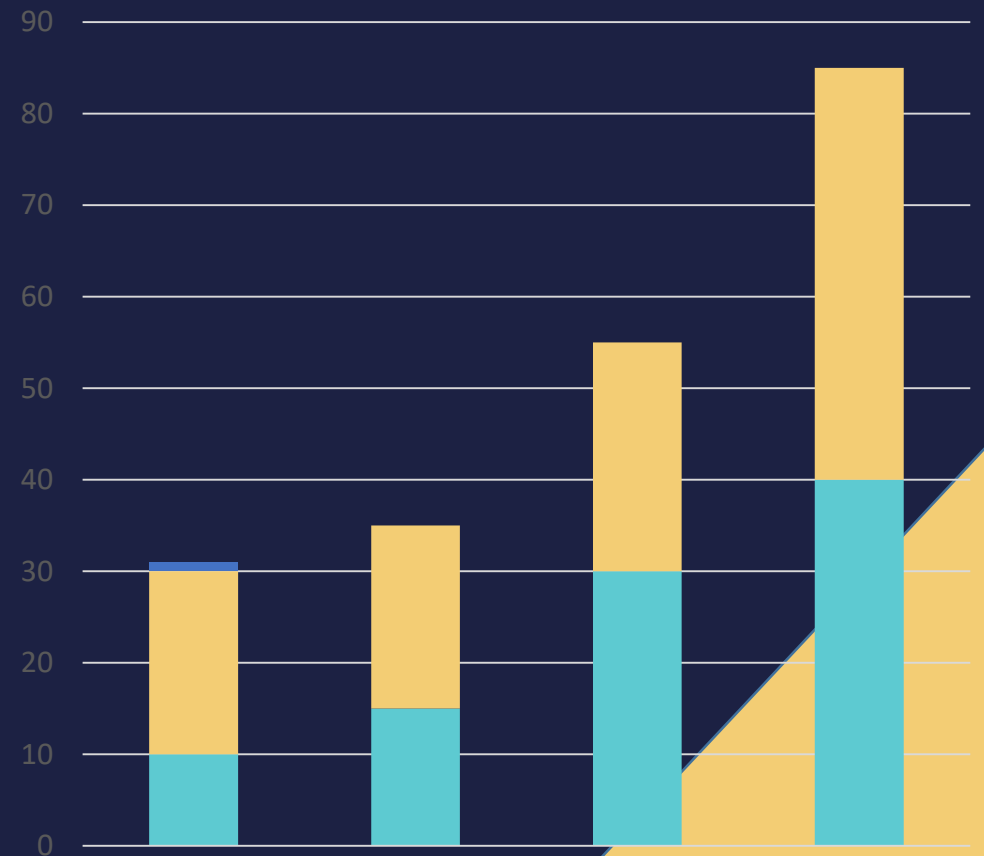
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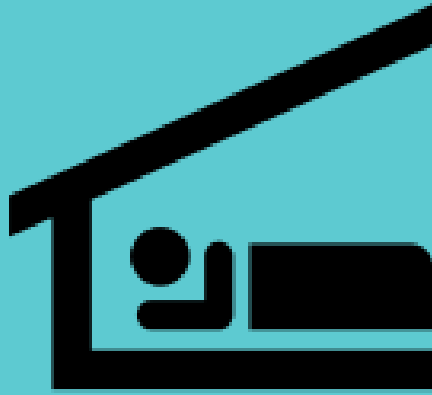
Continuum of Care

Program Expectations

Once services are up and running, the HESP program will operate a 24-hour outreach and crisis intervention hotline to navigate program services up on intake and screening. HESP will use a wraparound model with emergency shelter, health and safety education as the primary focus. Further, this program will provide immediate services to at-risk/high-risk homeless individuals and families who otherwise would not be able to access direct services.

HESP will be the very first centralized homeless services project in the City of Rialto.





City Of Rialto Homeless Advisory Council

The City of Rialto Homeless Advisory Council. Formerly known as the Homeless Task Force, Brings together a community of service providers, advocates, faith based organizations, civic organizations, and civilians to help identify issues of the homelessness and relevant solutions. The Homeless Tasks Force will support HESP.

Rialto Homeless Advisory Council: Core Focus

RESOURCES

Responsible for locating addition homeless resources for HESP clients. Resources include, not are not limited to: showers, clothing, food banks, etc..

HOUSING

Responsible for helping to locate various housing options for HESP clients

DIGNITY

Responsible for finding ways to help HESP clients maintain their sense of pride. Further, the Dignity group is responsible for identifying relevant ways to make connections, and formulate tactical methods of outreach to the homeless population

SENIORS

As one as the fastest growing demographics of the homeless population, the senior population is in need of special attention.

The senior group is responsible for locating homeless resources specific to the senior population.

HEAP Grant Application Process

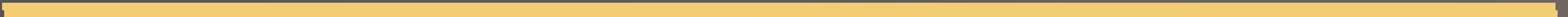
