PROPOSITION 68

- Parks and Water Bond Act of 2018
 - SB 5 (De León) California Drought, Water, Parks, Climate, Coastal Protection and Outdoor Access for All Act of 2018
- Authorized the sale of \$4.1B in general obligation bonds
- Funding for various programs related to:
 - Habitat conservation
 - Parks
 - Water-related projects
- Approved by California voters June 5, 2018
- Two funding components:
 - Statewide Park Program (SPP)
 - Per Capita Program



PROP 68 – STATEWIDE PARK PROGRAM (SPP)

- Competitive grant for critically underserved communities
- Eligible projects:
 - New parks
 - **Park expansion**
 - **Park renovations**
- \$200,000 – \$8,500,000 per project
 - No match (critically underserved) or 20% match
- Points awarded for 9 criteria
 - Critical lack of park space
 - Significant poverty
 - Community-based planning
 - Community challenges and project benefits



PROP 68 – PER CAPITA PROGRAM

- Non-competitive (population determines dollars)
- \$185,000,000 allocated to program
- Funds available for park:
 - Rehabilitation
 - Creation
 - Improvement
- Questionnaire of interest
- Project application
 - severely economically disadvantaged or 20% match
- Estimate of available funds:
 - \$200,000 per City
 - \$400,000 per County/District

Corona picnic and art show draws hundreds

CORONA — Several hundred people flowed through City Park Sunday in balmy sunny weather to enjoy a community picnic, art show and city-sponsored recreational activities.

The spring art festival, sponsored by the Corona Art Association, attracted several dozen artists who displayed more than a hundred works of art.

The sweepstakes winner was Carl Marshall, a member of the

Arlington Art Guild, who won the best-of-show award with a portrait painting of Clarence Muse, a prominent Riverside County composer and actor.


Marshall, a Riverside artist having his first showing in Corona, won a total of six ribbons, including a first place in oils and a first place in graphics. Among the Marshall works on display were a large portrait of an Indian

and several studies of black people.

The Old-Timers Association sponsored the community picnic, which drew former residents

from as far away as San Francisco, Portersville and Fresno.

The picnic has been an annual event in Corona since 1929, held the first Sunday in June.




“RECENT” ACTIVITY

 - 2010's – Basketball and Volleyball Courts




CITY PARK REUTILIZATION PLAN

- Unify park elements and purpose


REUTILIZATION PLAN VISION

PROP 84 GRANT PROJECT PROPOSAL (2017)




- Improved sports fields


