MCKINNEY-VENTO ACT WHO IS COVERED?

- Children who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate night time residence – Fed Code 11434
 - Sharing the house due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or similar reason.
 - Living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, camping grounds due to lack of adequate alternative accommodations.
 - Living in emergency or transitional shelters
 - Living in a public or private place not designed for humans to live.
 - Living in cars, parks, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations.








SCHOOL ENROLLMENT
