About Oceanside

Located in San Diego County, the <u>City of Oceanside</u> is on the coast between San Diego and Los Angeles. With a population of 173,000, Oceanside is the third largest city in the County.

The City is well known for sites such as the Oceanside Pier, and Mission San Luis Rey de Francia. The City has been working on recovery plans to move beyond the financial crises that much of the United States (U.S.) has been faced with.

Business Challenge

The City's previous budget process had many of the typical elements, and faced the same issues as most local governments. The City of Oceanside was required to prepare a combined biennial budget of \$315M. Each department had a designated "budget rep" responsible for preparing and managing the budget. Department budgets were created in separate excel spreadsheets.

Once department budgets were complete, the representatives sat down with the Finance team to review and prepare a consolidated budget spreadsheet. The Finance team had three employees dedicated full-time to this process. The consolidation proved to be challenging, as no business rules existed with regards to how the departments laid out or tracked their budgets. With no consistency, the process of finding the necessary data was extremely difficult. In addition, changes to budgets were often submitted in any number of methods including spreadsheet, word document, email, even as informally as handwritten. This caused a major issue with version control as there was no way to be certain the correct data was being used, and Finance would often pick up the wrong data and source files.

Linking was also an issue. With the original budget data stored in such a segregated and simplistic manner, there was no way of linking budget data back to its source, no backup file information available and no shared historical data.

The process was so disjointed, the City ended up exhaustively spending numerous man-hours in trying to reconcile and present a balanced budget. Access to real-time accurate data was difficult. At any time, the City Manager could request a budget update and it would take upwards of one week to compile the necessary information to give an accurate picture.

Time savings

The old process took months, beginning in December, for the finance staff to compile the information. With Questica Budget, departments aren't required to begin inputting budget data until March. The Finance team works on verifications, calculations and adjustments in April and May and a final document is presented to City Council for adoption the first week of June.

Robust salaries module

At first, the City was a bit skeptical that the Questica Budget Salaries module would be able to deliver as promised. However, they were pleased to discover that the module was extremely robust and could handle all the complicated calculations they required of it.

Now when Finance works with labor groups, they can run all the necessary scenarios for each bargaining group, even with the complex range of employees that are involved. Changes and modifications can be made, in response to changes in labor groups, on a group level, or down to specific employees and aren't limited to traditional contract timeframes, or budget cycles.

Forecasting

The City is just starting to explore the forecasting capabilities of Questica Budget. Due to the current fiscal environment they're facing, being able to understand the financial picture both today and in the future, is a huge benefit. Proactive steps can be taken to create a more sustainable financial picture for the City both short and long term.

About East Hampton

The Town of East Hampton with a population of 20,000 is comprised of the village of East Hampton, along with several nearby hamlets. Located in Suffolk County, the Town is the easternmost town in the state of New York. With its proximity to the Atlantic Ocean, numerous bays and harbors East Hampton's beaches provide the prime attraction for its residents and visitors alike.

Business Challenge

The Town of East Hampton had a straightforward process for budget preparation. However, the Town was faced with a fiscal crisis and a lack of confidence in the previous administration. Thus, the new administration was mandated with spending cuts and with developing a zero-based budget to ensure the cuts were made in the most effective manner.

Budget preparations began in August with departments receiving their prior year-to-date budget data in an Excel spreadsheet. New budget data was then entered in, either electronically or manually.

The Finance team compiled these individual worksheets into a master document with a budget total worksheet. The result was a very static budget that required a great deal of time and effort to make any changes required. Relying so heavily on Excel also brought the challenge of ensuring that formula errors didn't occur, and that cells were properly linked.

Salaries and benefits offered additional challenges. Budgets were developed based on prior year's budgets, with applied increases. Since the figures were based on assumptions, not on actual numbers, over-budgeting was a frequent issue.

Associating salaries and benefits data to specific employees proved impossible with the existing system. This data could only be associated on a broad level — so actual costs were out of sync with budgeted costs. One of the Town's budget objectives for the year was to eliminate costs through attrition of staff, so it was critical that these numbers be understood and budgeted for accordingly.

Budget accuracy, transparency and access to real-time budget tracking were key to the Town meeting its financial objectives.

About Palo Alto

With approximately 66,000 residents, the City of Palo Alto is located 35 miles south of San Francisco and 14 miles north of San Jose. The City of Palo Alto is more than 100 years old and is named after a majestic 1,000-year-old coastal redwood tree along San Francisquito Creek. As the City known as "Birthplace of the Silicon Valley", Palo Alto is recognized worldwide as a leader in cutting-edge technological development. Palo Alto is unique among California cities, as it is a full-service municipality that owns and operates its gas, electric, water, sewer, refuse and storm drainage services for its residences.

Business Challenge

The City of Palo Alto historically developed its annual budget (\$470 million for Fiscal Year 2015) for about 80 funds through a variety of manual processes and spreadsheets. Departments submitted their annual budget proposals to the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) on spreadsheets and then entered their proposals (numbers only) into SAP's budget planning module. All tasks including the General Fund Long Range Financial Forecast, labor cost modeling, financial reporting and the monitoring of the city's budget were all completed on spreadsheets. The manual workflow process was tedious, time consuming and resulted in multiple errors.

Solution

In October 2013, the City of Palo Alto sent out a Budget System RFP with six companies responding. Questica was chosen in June 2014 as the most technically qualified professional firm that submitted the most advantageous proposal and offered the lowest price for a vendor hosted solution. Implementation started mid-July and was completed by October in time for Palo Alto to develop its ten-year financial forecast in Questica Budget. By end of December, the workflow and budget submittal process was set up so that departments could submit budget requests in Questica in January 2015.

Palo Alto benefits from the accessibility and centralized database of Questica Budget. Questica Budget is accessible from any computer running Internet Explorer, Firefox, Chrome or Safari and can be installed locally on an organizations' servers or deployed in the cloud as the City of Palo Alto chose to do.

As a state-of-the-art web-based solution, Questica provides a familiar and intuitive spreadsheet like grid for data entry, minimizing the required training time, and allowing users to quickly get up to speed on the solution. Individual departments can access and track budgets in real-time, offering transparency and accountability to the budget process.

Business Benefits

Questica Budget offers the City of Palo Alto the opportunity to develop and submit their budgets quickly and seamlessly. Additionally, budget changes after the adoption of the budget are submitted and approved in Questica. Through an overnight batch process with the City's financial system, approved budget modifications are synced up.

Time savings leading to staff retention

By using Questica Budget, Palo Alto staff saves time as there no longer are multiple data entries and spreadsheets being passed around. With a centralized budgeting system, there is only one point of data entry and seamless integration with Palo Alto's SAP financial system. With the time savings of implementing Questica Budget, Palo Alto staff can leave at 5:00 pm to go home and be with their families. Questica Budget simplifies the budgeting process so staff does not have to work long hours and burn out. Staff retention has increased with the implementation of Questica Budget. Being web-based, staff can also log in and make edits at night if needed during peak budgeting season. Staff are no longer tied to their desks and can work when needed from home.

Cost savings

The time savings with Questica Budget also allows staff more time to be spent on analysis and higher value projects. Thereby the implementation of Questica Budget saves Palo Alto more than \$85,000 annually in productivity costs as the City can dedicate 0.5 full-time equivalent (FTE) Senior Management Analyst towards higher value tasks and Projects.

Configurable workflow

The City of Palo Alto's previous workflow process was that all departments submitted their proposed budgets to the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) and then entered their numbers into SAP. OMB then reconciled all the spreadsheets and tabulated the proposals to provide the decision makers with a packet of information for each budget and financial summary of each department. With Questica Budget, this old workflow process is automated, allowing the Senior Management Analyst in OMB to focus on performance measurement analysis and other value added program enhancements.

Flexibility to manipulate data

Questica Budget provides team members with the ability to set permissions on who can make changes to their budget at each stage of the budgeting process. Staff has the flexibility to duplicate, download and manipulate data. In addition, Questica Budget allows team members to view a record of all changes made, by whom they were made, and when they were made, using Questica Budget's Logging feature.

Any changes can be done easily throughout the year with the budget change request form, allowing money to be moved between GLs. Palo Alto staff can submit change requests and attach all necessary documentation in the notes section with Questica Budget's centralized system. This process leads to quicker approvals of funds.

Secure web-based solution hosted by Questica

As a web-based solution, Questica Budget allows Palo Alto staff to have access and full control over the day-to-day management of their budgets. Instead of emailing staff asking them to make small edits to the budget, this ownership enables staff to make changes to their budgets in a timely manner, and allows them to understand the impact of their budgets in a very real way.

Questica provides customers with the option of having the Questica Budget solution to be hosted by Questica. This was a key selling point for Palo Alto as they wanted the guarantee of having their budgets saved securely externally. By having Questica host the City's system, it allows for quicker recovery and flexibility in the event of earthquakes.

Financial Reporting and Monitoring

Questica also has a dashboard component that delivers the ability to provide an "at-a-glance" summary of critical data and other relevant information in a visually rich and interactive interface.

Former Director of Palo Alto's Office of Management and Budget, Walter Rossmann's favorite daily feature is Questica Dashboard as it allows him a quick glimpse through the day at the City's budget versus actual expenditures along with key performance measures and status of budget request reviews. Budgets can be monitored with dashboards and drill-down capability allowing Managers to control their budgets at a fund level, department level or cost center level. Dashboards can be developed for individual users, groups of users, departments, roles, or specific functional areas within Questica Budget.

About Shelby County

Shelby County is the largest county in Tennessee, both in terms of population and geography. Located in the Southwest corner of the state, Shelby's county seat is Memphis.

Business Challenge

Shelby County's budget process starts in late fall, and culminates with Commission approval in June. The County had been using the same budget process for many years and users were quite comfortable with it. However, it brought many challenges, including extensive data entry, ensuring accuracy of that data, a report system that was inflexible and complex, and difficulty in combing data with narrative text for program budgets.

A variety of Microsoft formats were used during all stages of budget preparation, including Microsoft's Access, Excel, Publisher and Word.

The database system was a critical component of the budgeting process. However, given its complexity and inflexibility, not many resources were familiar enough with it to make changes to the existing format. It was difficult to manipulate data to build scenarios or change modifiers, which resulted in a heavy reliance on the one to two resources with in-depth knowledge of the system. Reporting proved to be another challenge. Navigating the many existing queries and reports could be a source of confusion to users, while creating new reports presented issues in terms of time and design skills.

One of the biggest challenges in preparing the budget document is consolidating all information in as efficient a method as possible. A program budget is required for every single budget unit, including financial data and narrative text. Since no suitable product was available in their current library, Shelby County created the necessary documents by using a merge process in Word; however, this was a very cumbersome procedure that was not conducive to frequent changes.

Due to County protocol, the finance department was required to prepare the budget book twice — once in preparation for presentation to the County Commission, and again once the final budget had been approved. This proved quite a drain on resources, and required a tight turnaround.

Solution

A new budgeting solution had been on the County's mind for some time, but due to budget limitations, they weren't sourcing anything. Based on a recommendation by MS Govern, they agreed to a demonstration of the Questica Budget Suite, and were pleased to learn that Questica Budget could resolve many of their budgeting challenges and would integrate easily with their financial system and other software.

Business Benefits

The implementation at Shelby County was managed in several stages to accommodate their day-to-day operations. The first phase involved setting up the database, preparing the Budget Book and provided several immediate benefits. Phase Two provided will bring the County further benefits such as greater controls over position based budgeting, multi -year budgeting, modeling scenarios for different expenditure levels, and security controls over budgets through all stages of the budget.

Flexible reporting capabilities

Questica Budget provides robust report capabilities, enabling the County the flexibility they require. The structure of the 80-plus standard reports and custom reports the County has had developed, are such that a report can be run in a variety of configurations — by Fund, by Division, by Department, etc., in summary or detail mode. By providing this flexibility, a variety of people can now be involved in the preparation and running of reports for the budget books.

Quick turnaround on Budget Book preparation

Questica Budget simplifies the process of preparing budget books. Now, not only can more people be involved in the process, but the time required to change reports is reduced significantly. This frees up time for the finance department to focus on other job duties such as reviewing the financial data rather than producing it.

User friendly

Questica Budget is designed to mimic the structure of many familiar software applications. It is intuitive and makes the time required to understand and use the system much shorter. This reduces the dependency on a few key personnel and decentralizes the budget process. Feedback from the staff at Shelby indicated that the new system was very userfriendly, and an improvement over the previous complicated paper process.

Decentralization

Decentralization is a definite advantage to the Questica Budget system. Shelby's users appreciate having independent access to their data and reports throughout the process and the ability to add notes/vendor names, etc. to their budgets. Department heads are now aware of their budgets, including changes and real-time actuals. The County plans to use a "zero-based" approach next year for certain accounts, something that was not feasible in the past.

Supporting documentation

Questica Budget provides the ability to attach supporting documentation and notes, providing historical data required to make business decisions, and enabling department staff to understand why certain decisions have been made, by whom and when. This removes the laborious task of searching back through paper documents and searching emails to find the details they need.

Data integrity

Questica Budget establishes a very structured approach to budget entry and tracking. Users can not inadvertently "flip a switch" and make an unknown mistake, as they could do in the previous system. This allows users to have greater confidence in the data, and by extension, in the reports they run.

Multi-source report data

Questica Budget reports are designed to combine data from different sources. Program budgets can be run for every single budget unit, combined on one page, capturing financial data along with associated narrative text such as service level measurement, scenario, historical and current budget

information.

Narrowed responsibility

Having defined roles and responsibilities helps the County maintain accountability. The process of promoting and locking budgets as they progress up the approval chain, ensures control is maintained, and that only designated people can make changes to the data. It is clear at every stage what the responsibilities are for each individual.

Service level measurement

Performance measurement capabilities provide the County with a way to track and forecast an unlimited number of services per costing center. They can see and compare four years of data (current year plus previous three years), with an estimated and actual amount for each year. Full security controls ensure the integrity of the data. In addition, service level measurements are rolled forward to the next budget year, eliminating the need for data re-entry.

About Denver

With impressive views of the Rocky Mountains, the City of Denver is known as "the mile high city" because it's exactly 5,280 feet above sea level, or one mile high. It's also one of the fastest growing major cities in the United States with a population of approximately 682,500.

The client, the City and County of Denver, develops and implements its budgets through their Budget and Management Office (BMO), which strives to manage a balanced budget and to create an environment of operational efficiency and effectiveness.

Business Challenge

Development of the base budgets begins in April with the previous year's budget and any pre-approved minor changes. Submissions for change requests for additional funding are then reviewed and approved changes applied to the budget. Budget hearings then take place in September, with final adoption in November. The budget process involves multiple stages as it goes through Department Managers, the BMO, Mayor's Office and Council.

Denver's budgeting system was old and no longer met the requirements of flexible and comprehensive budgeting. Forecasting wasn't available, scenarios were hard to create and time-consuming and the system was not robust. It also lacked analytics, which was key to balance responsible budgeting with the needs of a rapidly growing city.

Solution

The City and County of Denver issued an RFP for a budget reporting and analysis software solution, and in 2015 Questica Budget was selected and implemented.

While Questica Budget doesn't change what information is collected, it does change the way it's accomplished. The new system was aligned with Denver's existing budget process so the budget development process remained largely the same.

However, the process of submitting, reviewing, and approving the budget has been streamlined and the visibility of the data has been improved.

Scenario based budgeting and forecasting

With Questica Budget Salaries, the BMO is able to handle the complexities of position and personnel budget development. The ability to run "what-if" scenarios on costs such as salaries, furloughs, and other benefits has been very timely. Long-term forecasting is available for variables, regular increase, revenues and expenses, and other elements.
