The Committee was provided a presentation by Ms. Joanne Coletta, Community Development Director, regarding the city's current ordinance off-premises identification governing signs (commonly known billboards) and billboard relocation agreements. Discussion took place between staff and the Committee regarding the city's billboard ban, the discretionary review of billboard relocation agreements and the lack of criteria in the city's sign ordinance when considering future billboard relocation agreements. Staff suggested adding potential relocation criteria the sign ordinance when considering future billboard The criteria discussed included: a) billboard relocations agreements. resulting in the removal of more than one billboard [staff recommended a removal to replacement ratio of 3:1], b) allowing relocations within 200 feet of the freeway only if the billboard was already within 100 feet of the freeway when a removal to replacement ratio of 3:1 cannot be done, or only allow relocations to occur on the same surface street as the billboard being relocated, and c) the square footage of relocated billboards is less than the square footage of the replaced billboard.

The Committee was receptive to the recommendations. Staff mentioned an amendment to the sign ordinance would need to occur to add the

criteria addressing billboard relocation agreements and that the municipal code amendment is subject to review by the Planning and Housing Commission and City Council.
